ACTIVITY 1: FLOOD RELIEF ACTIVITIES

(a) Volunteers of flood relief work of Karumalloor Grama Panchayat

Date: 20/07/2018 – 15/08/2018

Report: The NCC cadets involved in many flood relief activities.

An awareness class on health and hygiene was conducted by the Department of Health, Karumalloor Grama Panchayat on 20 July 2018. The cadets helped in chlorinating Karumalloor Grama Panchayath and conducted awareness campaign in five wards near to the college. NCC unit also distributed food and assisted in flood relief camp registration.



(b) Volunteers of Flood Relief Camp

Date: 15/08/2018 – 22/08/2018

Report: Union Christian College, Aluva was a big relief camp during the great flood of 2018. Around ten thousand inmates were in the camp during 15 to 22 August 2018. NSS Volunteers along with other volunteers worked very actively to provide food and shelter to the refugees. Many NCC cadets and ex-cadets participated in rescue and relief operations in the camp. The cadets sincerely took part in helping college authorities in managing a population of nearly 10,000 in the camp.

(c) Volunteers of post flood activities

Date: 29/08/2018 – 30/08/2018, 5/10/ 2018

Report: Around thirty NSS volunteers actively participated in the sorting and distribution of flood relief materials at Ernakulam Collectorate on 29 and 30 August 2018. Around 42 NCC cadets also served the district administration by volunteering in a relief material sorting/packing centre. Also cadets involved in distribution of relief materials.





(d) Volunteers of Rebuild Kerala Survey of Kadungalloor Grama Panchayat

Date: 17/09/2018, 18/09/2018 and 20/09/2018

Report: NSS volunteers and NCC cadets of Union Christian College, Aluva participated in the Rebuild Kerala Initiative - Damage Assessment Survey (Government of Kerala) in the flood affected areas of Kadungalloor Grama Panchayat. The Survey was conducted on 17, 18 and 20 September 2018, to assess the structural damage of 9534 houses in 21 wards of the Panchayat. 261 student volunteers registered for the survey and uploaded the damage details through the Rebuild Kerala app using geo tagging technology.







(e) Contribution of Computers

Date: 16/11/ 2018

Report: The Outreach and Women Empowerment Cell of MCA Department contributed two desktop personal computers with all peripherals to Government L. P. School, East Kadungalloor which had lost most of the IT equipment in the natural calamity happened on 15 August 2018. On 16 November 2018 at 3.30 pm in the MCA Conference Hall, Rev. Prof. Thomas John, Manager, Union Christian College handed over the computers to Mr. Babu Paul, Headmaster, Government L. P. School, East Kadungalloor.



(f) Collection point at Union Christian College during Kerala Floods 2019

Date: 10/08/2019 – 13/08/2019

Report: During the Kerala floods of 2019, Union Christian College became a main collection point for the flood affected people of in and around Kerala. NSS volunteers were active participants in the collection point. Materials were collected and send to Nilambur and Wayanad. 14000 dress





materials, 4470 sanitary napkins, 2023 diapers, 1890 cleaning materials, 685 variety of medicines, 1250 food items, 270 mosquito coils, 121 mats, 593 toothpaste and brush, 686 soaps, 194 Kg Rice, 68 Kg different types of Cereals and 200 water bottles were collected and was handed over to the affected area.



(g) ‘Twinkle twinkle little star - Beam of happiness

Date: 13/08/2019

Report: “Twinkle Twinkle little star – Beam of happiness” is another initiative taken by the NSS unit of Union Christian College, Aluva to help the children that were affected by the flood. Online campaigning was started in order to collect toys, books, sketch pens, pencils, pens etc.





(h) Flood relief kit distribution – ‘Santhwanam 2019’

Date: 19/08/2019, 20/08/2019

Report: The programme was conducted jointly by NSS volunteers, Teaching and Non-teachings staff of the college, to help the households affected by the 2019 floods. 50 flood affected households of Paruvakkad area of Malikampeedika, Aluva were identified and selected through surveys by the NSS volunteers. Each household was given a kit worth Rs. 2000/- which was contributed by teaching staff of the college. NSS volunteers along with the staff actively participated in sorting and packing the items. The flood relief kit was distributed by the Principal Dr. David Saj Mathew. It was a moment of immense pleasure and pride to watch the happiness in the faces of the victims. Panchayat member and President was also a part of the meeting titled ‘Santhwanam 2019’.





(i) Collection of materials towards the Assam flood relief

Date: 29/07/2019 – 31/07/2019

Report: ‘No. 20 Assam Mail’ was an initiative by the NSS unit of Union Christian College, Aluva to help those affected by the floods in the state of Assam and Bihar. Campaigning was conducted in the campus in order to collect the materials required to send to the affected zones. Materials were collected and sorted by the NSS volunteers. All the primary items required for the survival of people were identified and were collected. It includes dress, toothbrush, paste, sanitary napkins, bedsheets, blankets, soaps, detergents etc. The boxes were handed over to Mr. Jobin George of B P S College, Piramadom by the Principal, Dr. David Saj Mathew of the college.








(b) A music event – “Oppam paadam”

c) Celebration of White Cane Day with blind students

- White Cane Day celebration

Date: 15/10/2022

Report : The 'White Cane Day' was celebrated on 15 October 2022 in which the NSS volunteers take the initiative in conducting program that includes a rally, general meeting & exhibition which was presented by the students of Blind School, Keezhmaad. The students from other institutions were also part of it. The blind students showed their skills and talents during the session.





- **‘White Cane Day – Visit to the Blind School**

Date: 15 October 2019

Report: As part of the ‘White Cane Day’, NSS volunteers visited the Blind School, Keezhmad and they had an interactive session with the students at the school. There was an exhibition of handcrafted items made by the students of the school. There was an orientation session about Blind Football by Mr. Sujith Aroor, current Goalkeeper of the Indian Blind Football team.



- (d) **‘We Care’ fund collection**

Date: 17/10/2022

Report: To help the vulnerable groups in need of immediate assistance, Government of Kerala started a project called ‘We Care’ in association with National Service Scheme. The amount was collected from the students and teachers in which very good response was there from everyone. The collected money was handed over to the program.



(e) The food donation – “Snehasparsham”

Date: 10/02/2023

Report: The food and stationary materials were handed over to the Welfare Association Trust, South Veliyathunadu on 10 February 2023. Those materials were the balance products of the Seven Day NSS camp which handed over to them with at most care and with understanding the concern for the need of humanity in the society.





(f) Newspaper collection - Old age home visit

- “Kadalassuthoni” campaigning

Date: 23 December 2019

Report: “Kadalassuthoni” is a new initiative by the NSS volunteers to collect old newspapers from households and to sell them for recycling. The fund obtained so will be used for providing food for children in the orphanages once in a month. An online campaign was started to create awareness of the initiative and to collect newspapers from the households of the students was held on 9-11 September 2019.

As part of the “Kadalassuthoni” initiative, NSS volunteers went to households nearby college and collected old newspapers on 12 October 2019. A total of 1000 Kg was collected. The newspapers collected from households and from the college, as part of the “Kadalassuthoni” initiative was sold to a recycling plant on 14 October 2019. The money is decided to be used for social works.

- Old age home visit - “Ammakilikkoodu”

Date: 23 December 2019

Report: NSS volunteers spend a day with grandparents in an old age home “Karunalayam”, Sreemoolanagaram. The program was conducted as a Christmas celebration for dear mothers. 


Impact: These initiatives inculcate a compassionate act with tangible and emotional benefits for recipients as well as personal growth and community engagement opportunities for the donors.
