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OBJECTIVE: SDG3 - GOOD HEALTH AND WELL BEING

ACTIVITY 1: AWARENESS PROGRAMMES ON WOMEN AND CHILD HEALTH

(a) 'Marodanachu' - An open discussion on the clinical and social dimensions of breastfeeding

Date: 06/08/2020

Report: An online awareness session on clinical and social dimensions of Breastfeeding was conducted on 6 August 2020 in observance of International Breastfeeding week. The session was held in association with Junior Chamber International (JCI) Cochin chapter. Panel discussion involving Dr. Rani Vinod, Gynaecologist, General Hospital, Ernakulum and Ms. Swati Jagdish, Lactation Consultant was the key event. Dr. Elizabeth V. Mathew was the moderator. Importance and challenges of breastfeeding were discussed. Solutions to the challenges were highlighted. There were approximately 54 participants representing various segments of society – students, academicians, clinicians and mothers.





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(b) Breast cancer awareness camp

Date: 29/10/2021

Report: Breast cancer is the most common malignancy among women in Kerala accounting for up to 30 per cent of all cancers. Early detection is of prime importance in its treatment. The Research and Post Graduate Department of Psychology in association with Aster Medcity, organized an awareness programme for the staff and students of Union Christian College on 29 October 2021, at 11 am at Varkey Memorial Hall in the college. The programme was an extension activity of the department. It was attended by around 50 participants comprising of members of non-administrative staff, administrative staff and teaching staff, in addition to students from various academic departments. The health care team from Aster Medcity comprised of nursing staff members, social worker and human resource personnel. They explained different methods of conducting breast self-examination. The information was supplemented with use of videos, pictures and demonstration. The audience took active interest and participated well in the discussion that followed. The discussion revolved around sharing experiences of fights against cancer, developing the right attitude towards life experiences and also the practical challenges of breast self-examination and undertaking a mammography test.





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(c) Safe and healthy menstrual practices

Date: 05/03/2022

Report: Extension activity on 'Safe and healthy menstrual practices' was conducted in Kadamakudy panchayath on 5 March 2022, in association with Kadamakudy Panchayath and Junior Chamber International (JCI) Cochin chapter. A session on 'Sexual and Reproductive Health' was taken by Dr. Avani Pillai, Associate Professor, Amrita Fertility Centre and Ms. Savitha Shenoy, Project Officer, Kerala AIDS Control Society. Participants were sensitized on the advantages of menstrual cups as a healthy sustainable alternative to sanitary pads. Queries on menstrual hygiene were cleared by the resource persons. 57 women of the panchayath attended the session. Three faculty members and five students from the department organized the activity.







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(d) 'Cup of life' - Distribution of menstrual cups

Date: 01/09/2022

Report: "Cup of life", an initiative of Shri. Hibi Eden, Member of Parliament, was inaugurated by the Principal Dr. M. I Punnoose in Union Christian College by handing over menstrual cup on 01 September 2022. About 800 menstrual cups were distributed in the campus under the leadership and guidance of NSS volunteers.







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(e) Webinar on 'Female Diseases'

Date: 30/10/2021

Report: Research and Post Graduate Department of Chemistry in association with Arya Vaidya Sala, Kottakkal conducted a webinar on "Female Diseases" on 30 October 2021. Dr. Kavitha P, Assistant Physician, Aryavaidyasala, Kottakkal was the speaker and she elaborated on common problems faced by women especially, menstruation, irregular periods and other gynaecological health issues.






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(f) Awareness class on 'Female hygiene'

Date: 15/02/2023

Report: An awareness class on 'Female hygiene' was conducted by the College Union in association with C & A Healthcare on 15 February 2023 at OCL classroom. The resource person was Ms. Jesna P. J. who is the sales promoter of C & A Healthcare. The class covered different topics such as changes during menstruation, personal hygiene etc. The program was open to all the students in the college and 112 students participated in the program from different departments.






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(g) Awareness talk on 'Prevention of Anaemia'

Date: 13 June 2021

Report: NSS unit organized an awareness talk on 'Prevention of Anaemia' in collaboration with Department of Women and Child Welfare and ICDS Alangad on 13 June 2021. Resource person of the program was Dr. Indu A, Ayurvedic Consultant. 23 students participated in the webinar.



Impact: This initiative facilitate students with an awareness of safe and healthy menstrual practices are crucial for addressing a range of health, social and gender related issues, promoting well-being and equality. It also addressed the vital role in improving individual health and promoting a healthier and more productive society.



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ACTIVITY 2: BLOOD DONATION

a) Blood donation camp 1

Date: 01/10/2022

Report: In connection with the centenary celebrations of Union Christian College, Aluva a blood donation camp was organised in collaboration with Indian Medical Association, Aluva. The program was inaugurated by Shri. Anwar Sadath, Member of Legislative Assembly in which NSS & NCC were there with their active presence.





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b) Blood donation camp 2

Date: 15/03/2019

Report: NSS unit of Union Christian College, Aluva conducted a one-day blood donation camp on 15 March 2019 at VMA Hall, in association with Indian Medical Association, Aluva chapter. Fifty volunteers donated blood.







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c) Blood donation camp 3

Date: 22/07/2019

Report: On 18, 19 July 2019, NSS organized a campaigning for the Blood Donation Camp which was held on 22 July 2019 in association with Indian Medical Association, Kochi. Importance of blood donation and the role students need to play in such scenarios was conveyed to the students. The badges, charts and placards made by the NSS volunteers for the same were well used for this. The details of the students who were willing to donate blood were collected.

The blood donation camp was conducted on 22 July 2019 in association with IMA Kochi. Almost 80 college students came up willingly to donate blood for the camp. From the 80, 57 students were able to donate blood to the blood bank. Teaching and non-teaching staff were also active participants in the event.







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d) Blood donation camp 4

Date: 07/01/2020

Report: A blood donation camp was conducted by our NSS unit in association with Blood Bank, General Hospital, Ernakulum on 7 January 2020. Blood was donated by 41 students of

our college.







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


e) Dr. Kalam Blood Donation (DKD) App

Date: 22/07/2019

Report: Dr. Kalam Blood Donation (DKD) app is an innovative initiative of the NSS unit of Union Christian College, Aluva. It reduces the efforts of finding a donor at critical times. There is no need to go to every class and enquire about donors, instead with just a click all the donor details will be available and contacting them would be easy. Olympian Joby Mathew inaugurated the program on 22 July 2019. Cine Actress Urmila Unni was the special guest for the event. All the NSS volunteers of the college actively participated in the inaugural function.

The collection of details of the students who were willing to donate blood was done by the NSS volunteers on 23, 24 and 25 July 2019 and the donors list was enrolled in the app. Details required in the DKD app were Name of the student, Year, Department, Phone number and Blood group.





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






ACTIVITY 3: EYE / MEDICAL CAMP

(a) UC-LF Nilavu – Free eye check up camp

Date: 11/02/2023

Report: The UC-LF Nilavu was a free eye check up camp conducted by the NSS volunteers in association with Little Flower Hospital, Angamaly on 11 February 2023. The intention of the programme is to make the locality free of cataract persons. The check-up and inauguration of the programme was held simultaneously in the VMA Hall in which 200 persons had come for the check-up. The inauguration was done by Shri. Anwar Sadat, Member of Legislative Assembly, Aluva.

A training session was conducted for the volunteers on 4 February 2023, which had been conducted by the doctors & staff of LF hospital, Angamaly. The session was the base of the 'UC- LF Nilavu 2022-23'. As a part of Nilavu, the NSS Volunteers had done the publicity of the event through distribution of notices in the localities. They also helped the needy ones by doing the Pre-Registration for the check-up on 4 February 2023. A class campaign was conducted on 7 February 2023 to ensure the clear outreach of the campaign among the students. During the campaign the volunteers had asked for their active support & participation.

The student volunteers including NSS, NCC of other institutions were also been a part of it. The volunteers of National Service Scheme Unit No. 52 were also the part of the auspicious event held at Union Christian College Aluva.







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Impact: The event facilitated positive impact on student's health, academic performance and overall wellbeing, contributing to a healthier and more productive college community. Theses camp can also faster a sense of community and responsibility for one health among students. The events contributed to the well-being of students and campus community, addressing health issues, fostering education and promoting a culture of health and wellness.

ACTIVITY 4: COUNSELLING, PSYCHOLOGICAL AND ACADEMIC SKILL TRAINING PROGRAMMES

(a) Psychological first aid for flood affected community

During the 2018 flood, Union Christian College was the biggest relief camp.
 Psychology students provided Psychological First Aid in the camp, especially children benefited more with the interactive sessions provided for them in the form of Play therapy and Art therapy.



• The department conducted a series of training program for students to provide continued support for the flood affected community around the college with the help of expert alumni of the department. Students and faculty members visited nearby panchayats and schools to interact with people and to provide psychological support. They visited individual homes, community health centers for this purpose.



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b) Tele counselling


- During Covid 19 pandemic the faculty, students and the research scholars of the department took initiative to provide free Tele Counselling to affected people. 50 people benefited from this service.
- 10 PG students of Department of Psychology in association with Kodungalloor Municipality provided a 35 days Tele Counselling program from 27 May to 30 June 2022 for Covid 19 patients and people in quarantine. 500 people benefited out of this during the peak period of Covid 19 pandemic.





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(b) Counselling, psychological and academic skills training for students

 Third year UG and First and Second year PG students of the department have visited various schools across the state and provided counselling, psychological skills training and academic skill training for students with disabilities. They have provided screening and assessment services to special schools on movement therapy, dance therapy, narration and storytelling for language development.



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Assessments and therapy for children with special needs

 Department of Psychology provided a series of programs in various schools across the state to provide assistance to students to cope with academic uncertainties and personal problems due to Covid 19. The sessions were designed to suit students from different classes (KG to 10th) based on their level of development. The faculty members conducted sessions on parenting and student management. Third year UG and First and Second year PG students conducted sessions for students on Mental Health issues, Memory, Learning techniques, Assertiveness, Communication and



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relationship management skills, sexual and menstrual hygiene, addiction and sexual abuse. This has been done in both online and offline mode. 1200 students and 300 teachers and parents benefited out of this program.

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





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 More than 25 sessions on counselling, awareness and training for parents, teachers and students were conducted during June-July 2021.





 As part of their field work, all students (19) of first year M. Sc. Psychology went to Govt. L. P. School, Chamaparambu on 22 November 2022. They interacted with 21 first standard students and assessed their intellectual functioning using the Seguin Form Board test. Initially, rapport was established through an interactive session. The students were very cooperative and interested in doing the test. They were also motivated to perform excellently in academics.




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• 15 students of second year M. Sc. (c) Training programs for persons with disability



Skill Development Program for Persons with Disability, Supported by Indian Oil Corporation, Kerala State Office








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(d) Assessment of cognitive functions of students at School for Blind, Aluva

Research and Postgraduate Department of Psychology, Union Christian College, Aluva and Basic Life Skills Centre (BLISS) in association with Service Learning Centre organized the assessment of cognitive functions of students at School for Blind, Aluva on 11 August 2022. The assessments were conducted by Dr. Marikutty P. J., Assistant Professor; Ms. Asha Ravi, Clinical Psychologist and Research Scholar, Department of Psychology and 16 psychology postgraduate students and were observed by 2 students from ICU, Japan. The psychological tests used for assessment include Vineland Social Maturity Scale (VSMS), Binet Kamat Test (BKT), Malin's Intelligence Scale for Indian Children (MISIC). Assessment was done for 22 students.



(e) Peer interactive awareness program 'Demystifying Mental illness'

As part of World Mental Health day celebrations, Basic Life Skills Centre (BLISS) in association with the Department of Psychology organized a peer interactive awareness program 'Demystifying Mental illness' for all the students in UC College from 2.30 to 3.30 pm on 18 & 19 October 2022.

All Post Graduate and Final Year Undergraduate students of the Psychology department conducted the session in 62 classes including MBA and MCA. We could reach out to almost 1900 students of our college creating awareness on mental health and eliminating myths about mental illnesses.

(f) Counselling sessions for children in orphanages

As part of extension activities carried out in neighbouring communities, second year M. Sc. students of Psychology Department visited the orphanage near the college and interacted with the inmates (adolescent girls) on 17 September 2022. 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(g) International student interaction and focused discussion

ACTIVITY 5: AWARENESS PROGRAMMES ON COVID-19

(a) Vaccination camp

Date: 09/10/2021

Report: On 9 October 2021, a Covid-19 vaccination camp was held at the college for college students in Kalamassery constituency ahead of the reopening of colleges. NSS volunteers volunteered the program, guiding the students and others by giving necessary directions to them. They were also engaged in maintaining COVID-19 protocols such as providing sanitizers to the people, maintaining social distance, etc.

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(c) COVID-19 awareness programme and flash mob

Date: 27/02/2020

Report: Department of Zoology in association with COVID-19 Cell, Ernakulam Government Hospital and Karumalloor Primary Health Centre jointly conducted a demo on preventive measures of COVID-19 on 27 February 2020. Dr. Sherin Joseph from Government Hospital, Ernakulam and a staff nurse led the demo and talk. A flash mob was conducted by zoology students to attract attention of the college community towards the event.





d) Course on 'COVID-19 Training for NCC Cadets'

Date: 13/06/2020 - 14/05/2020

Report: Government of India has launched a training module for management of COVID-19 named Integrated Government Online Training Portal on ministry of HRD's DIKSHA platform to take care of the training needs of the frontline workers and to build their capacity to handle the pandemic effectively. Our 45 NCC cadets (7 KERALA GIRLS BN, NCC – THRISSUR) successfully attended and got certified for courses on 'COVID-19 training for NCC cadets' on 13 June 2020 to 14 May 2020. The platform provided training module on flexitime and on site basis, so that the COVID-19 responses can be delivered at scale for the workforce needed to tackle the pandemic.





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(d) Appreciation to our local healthcare workers and police department

Date: 23/10/2019

Report: 50 NCC cadets (7 KERALA GIRLS BN, NCC - THRISSUR) heart fully appreciated our Local Healthcare Workers and Police Department who has been working hard providing their selfless service during COVID-19 pandemic. 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
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(c) Session on 'Basic life support and CPR skill training'



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


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(e) "Drishti" - Awareness session on 'Eye donation'


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b) ASAAD Sena







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ACTIVITY 11: PALLIATIVE CARE ACTIVITIES

(a) Snehasparsham - Veliyathunadu Palliative Care Unit Visit

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(b) One Touch Pain and Palliative Club Activities

Report:

Pain and Palliative care volunteers' unit was initiated by a group of Psychology students, Union Christian College, Aluva during 2012 -2013. Later the whole college took the programmes to their hearts, now it has around 100 volunteers. It is a joint venture of teachers & students to provide continuous care to the terminally ill patients and to create awareness in the vibrant student community about palliative care. It is to remind students about the needs of people suffering from pain and distress and encourage them to serve the needy in every small possible way, to alleviate their sufferings. The students get no grace marks or other benefits, but participate in the activities as a service.

Activities (2018-2019)

1. **ORMA 2018** – A wonderful gathering of about 75 paraplegia patients was organized in VMA hall, Union Christian College, in March 2019. Mr. Arun Jose, of Insight Soft Skill and Motivational training centre conducted an orientation programme for the patients.





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2. Visit to Lulu Mall: volunteers accompanied patients to Lulu mall and gifted them a grocery packet.



3. **Visit to Kuzhuppilly beach** – The students escorted the paraplegia patients to Kuzhuppilly beach for a day out, in April.



4. **Visit to Oncology and Isolation wards of the general Hospital, Ernakulam** –The program brought the unit members closer to the sufferings of the terminally ill



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5. **Material collection and fund raising** for patients of Bethlehem Abhaya Bhavan, Kodanadu.

ACTIVITIES (2019 -2020)

1. **ORMA 2019**: Gathering of 50 paraplegia patients along with their bystanders in March 2020. A motivational session was provided by Adv. Jimmy Jose, Red Cross society member. Our volunteers arranged a pleasure trip in metro railway for paraplegia patients.





- 2. The students **visited Sneha Jyothi Sisubhavan**, an orphanage, on 19 January 2018 to distribute essential items.
- 3. A **two-day training program** was held at the Pain and Palliative Care unit of Anwar Hospital, under guidance of Dr. Hyderali
- 4. On palliative care day, 24 volunteers participated in the gathering of paraplegia patients at the General Hospital, Aluva. Stalls are set up on Thursdays for the sale of household products made paraplegia patients.



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


ACTIVITIES (2020- 2022)

ACTIVITIES (2022-2023)

1. The activities of the unit started with an orientation programme by Bini Manoj, Nurse, Government Hospital, Aluva. The programme included a training session for unit members, on how to maintain physical hygiene of bedridden patients.





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2. The students of the club set up stalls periodically for the sale of the products like soap, liquid wash, bathroom wash etc. prepared by paraplegia patients, giving them a source of income.



3. 12 unit members participated as volunteers in a job fair programme organized for locomotor disable patients held at Cottolengo North Paravur Centre.





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4. Financial assistance of Rs.3000/- was given for a cerebral Palsy patient for renovating his bathroom.



Impact: Events in connection with palliative care activities can be meaningful and transformative experience for students and helping others in their end-of-life journey can be emotionally rewarding and contribute to the mental well-being of students.




Recent Triumphs:


