18.	<p><b>Vidwan P. G. Nair Endowment:</b> In the year 2000, the children of Vidwan P. Gopalan Nair set up an endowment in UC College in their father's name to promote research and advanced studies in Malayalam literature. This has been the single largest endowment in UC College's history with a start-up amount of Rs. 11, 00,000. Interest accruing annually from the fund is used to provide research fellowships. In addition, Dr. Samgadharan established the Vidwan P. G. Nair Loan Scholarship with a contribution of Rs. 2,00,000 as well. Since 2007, under the auspices of the Endowment, the Vidwan P. G. Nair Memorial Research Centre at the Malayalam Department has been annually conducting a comprehensive literary and cultural program over the course of three days. The program consists of seminar presentations by invited leaders in Malayalam literature, and outstanding cultural programs that depict the art and cultural heritage of Kerala. The Malayalam Department needs to be commended for its imaginative development of these events each year which have become an eagerly awaited draw for the whole campus and the community. The seminar themes are carefully selected by the Malayalam Department, and the proceedings are published as books and released during the opening ceremony of the following year's program. 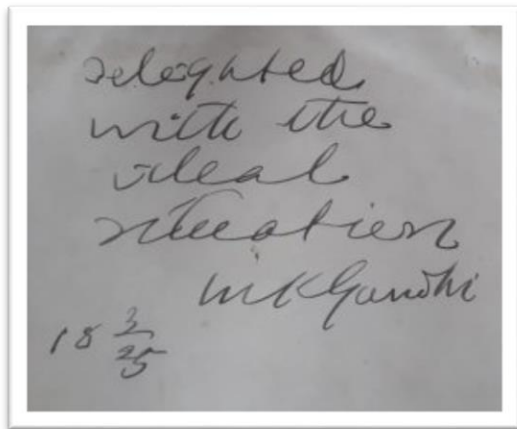

## Heritage Preservation

The college is honoured to inherit the proud heritage of accolades and endorsements from the various eminent leaders of the nation who visited the institution in the past.

Mahatma Gandhi visited the college on the 18<sup>th</sup> of March 1925 and recorded in the visitors' diary his appreciation for the ideal conditions here. The sapling planted by him on the occasion, now a mango tree, is preserved in front of the administrative block as a testimony to the Mahatma's ideals.





The college was honoured by the visit of Gurudev Rabindranath Tagore in 1922, who acknowledged in his address to the community his joy at witnessing here the quintessential spirit of his Shantiniketan. In the same year the college was visited by Lord Irvin, the Viceroy of India then.

The other prominent personalities who visited the college during its fledgling years include Shri Ram Manohar Lohia (1950), Shri. K. P. Kesava Menon (1953), Shri. Jayaprakash Narayanan (1954), Shri. Morarji Desai (1957), Dr. Stanley Jones (1958), Shri. C. Rajagopalchari (1960), Shri V K Krishnamenon. The legacy has continued since then with other luminaries like Shri V. V. Giri, Shri. Shankar Dayal Sharma, Dr. A. P. J. Abdul Kalam honoring the college with their presence on various occasions. Union Christian College's tryst with this heritage is kept alive in this generation too.

Kachery Malika is a Protected monument by the Department of Archaeology in the college campus. Its renovation is done by the Archelogy department at periodic intervals. Other Old buildings like, the Varkey memorial Hall, are also maintained in the campus.



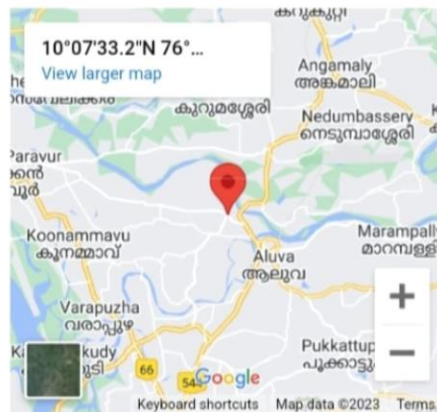

The Cutchery Malika on the U.C College campus is a protected monument of the Department of Archaeology. The Department entrusted to the Cutchery Malika Renovation Committee, the task of restoring the building. The District Collector was the Chairman of the Committee and the Principal, U.C College was the Convener. The Department of Archaeology, too was represented on the committee.

The Department of Forests assigned 10 cum (M<sup>3</sup>) of teakwood for the work on the recommendation of the Department of Archaeology.

Due to delay in the release of grants, the committee could not take possession of the timber before the deadline. The date was extended on request through proper channel. The committee never anticipated that penal charges would be levied on this account, since the delay was due to the late release of grants. Hence the committee refunded the unspent portion of the grants (Rs.93216/-) to the Government. The committee has ceased to exist after the formal completion of the assigned task.

The Divisional Forest Officer, Perumbavoor issued me a notice for the remittance of the penal interest (Rs.42481/-). I have made representations to the Principal Secretary, Finance Department, The Under Secretary, Department of Forests & Wildlife and the Director, Department of Archaeology to waive the penal interest, or to sanction a grant for its remittance. The response to these representations is awaited.
