4.2 Computerization of administration and library

In 2015, an automatic counter of entrants to the library was installed to monitor the number of daily walk-ins.

During 2015-16, the library subscribed to 34 printed journals. Besides, the clientele of the college library can access an online package of e-journals (6000+) and e-books (1, 50,000+) subscribed through the NLIST program of INFLIBNET. The Online Public Access Catalogue accessible from all the 12 machines available in the library, and from the departments. The library owns 12 desktops, one HP Server, a scanner cum reprographic machine, and two a printer. The LAN facilitates 24/7 days 10 Mbps broadband internet connectivity made available with the support of NMEICT facility.

Counselling – The department of Psychology offers counselling sessions for group therapy; and free discussions on personal and social issues for both students and staff.

Career Guidance - The Career Guidance cell serves as a vital link between the students of the college and the potential employers of Industry. It helps the students with appropriate guidance to establish links with the industry and get placement. Effective coaching is given in this direction to the students. The Training and Placement Cell of the College has initiated a Training Process for students of all departments in Verbal ability, Quantitative ability etc.. Special sessions to impart training for Group Discussion, to prepare CV, and successfully tackle interviews are organised. About 7 companies visited the College Campus and 72 students from various departments were given placement in the industry.

6. Governance, Leadership and Management

6.1 State the Vision and Mission of the institution

The Union Christian College aims for a wholesome education of the young in order to bring out the best in each individual. It strives to produce intellectually competent morally upright and spiritually inspired, patriotic men and women who will serve the country with dedication and fervour. The college commits itself to promoting justice and peace, preserving and enhancing the integrity of creation, fostering wholesome and simple life styles, empowering the vulnerable sections of our society and cultivating greater national integration and harmony among diverse religions, cultures, linguistic groups and nationalities

6.2 Does the Institution has a management Information System

Yes, The MIS is used for admission process, database of students, financial administrative purposes through tally. However it is to be extended to other areas too.

6.3 Quality improvement strategies adopted by the institution for each of the following:

6.3.1 Curriculum Development

Curriculum development is systematically processed once in 5 years by the University. The syllabus is reviewed and suggestions for revision are made to the University through members of the various Boards of Studies after feedback from the students. 13 faculty members belong to various departments of the college are involved in the board of studies of the Mahatma Gandhi University

6.3.2 Teaching and Learning

The college has an objective and effective system of student evaluation (Internal) through which a meaningful teaching and learning is assured. Testing and evaluation patterns are constantly reviewed to ensure quality in critical thinking and competence. Walk with Scholar programme of the Higher Education Department was implemented effectively. 10 teachers and 60 students were benefited by the programme. Scholar support programme of the Higher Education Department was implemented effectively. 15 teachers and 150 students were benefited by the programme. Curriculum and syllabi for PhD course work was prepared by the History Department.

6.3.3 Examination and Evaluation

University is conducting external exams for UG and PG programmes. Internal setting of question papers for semester examinations is done by the college. The college has been maintaining an objective system of conducting internal examination and evaluation. The Research coordinator supervises the research work in the college and encourages the research potential of the college with adequate infrastructure support. The staffs are constantly encouraged to apply for minor projects and major projects from UGC and other funding agencies. Two minor research projects are sanctioned during this academic year. The U C College has been approved by Mahatma Gandhi University as one of the centres to conduct course work for Ph. D program and Ph.D. course work is continuously supervised from the beginning till the Viva Voce examination. PG and UG projects are also monitored by supervisors rigorously. 43 research scholars are working in the research Departments. 21 research articles are published during the academic year. All science departments are equipped with instrumentation laboratories

6.3.5 Library, ICT and physical infrastructure / instrumentation

Library

Right now the library has a collection of approximately 81,140 printed documents including bound volumes and gift copies. The library provides open access for all students and faculty. To encourage the usage, library has instituted 'Best User Award' for undergraduate and postgraduate students. During 2015-16, awards were distributed to six (three undergraduates and three postgraduates) students on the College Day. The college was one among the top ten users of the NLIST (E-resource package provided by INFLIBNET) during the January – March 2016.

ICT

A Common Computer Facility with 20 computers, printer, and scanner is made available for students and research scholars. Packages for Word processing, spreadsheets, and presentations are also available here. The students can surf internet, and prepare their dissertations at this facility. Besides, computer labs, placement cell, guidance bureau together have 400 computers for the services of students.

The Department Physics has purchased a Microprocessor programmable controller, Muffle Furnace, and Mass Flow Controller.

6.3.6 Human Resource Management

Students and faculty attend seminars and training programmes and many national and international seminars and lectures organized by various departments of the college every year. Programmes like ASAP, Walk with a Scholar, skill training programmes to improve computer proficiency, analysis of research data, moral and ethical practices in personal and professional life *etc* are conducted throughout each academic year. Through various projects and programmes aided by UGC, UBCHEA, Ford pathways, CSRS *etc*, experiential learning opportunities are created. Net coaching classes are offered in certain departments; other career guidance and placement related are also offered using the agency of Career Guidance and placement Cell.

6.3.7 Faculty and Staff recruitment

Being an affiliated college of Mahatma Gandhi University, as per the stature of the University, and rules of the State government, the college appoint teaching and non-teaching staff. The selection committee for appointment of teachers includes the Manager of the College, the Principal of the College, one representative each from the government and University *etc*. The selection is based on the merit of the candidates, and ensures high level of transparency. The appointment of non-teaching staff is also done as per the statute of the University.

6.3.8 Industry Interaction / Collaboration

The Department of Physics has research collaborations with universities and colleges in India abroad, The IITs in Bombay, IIT Chennai, BITS Goa, Hope College. Similarly, faculty of Physics have been associating with the Department of Atomic Energy, Govt. of India, under the funding of UGC. Department of Botany has been collaborating with the Rajiv Gandhi Institute of Biotechnology, Trivandrum for research purposes.

6.3.9 Admission of Students

The merit seats are filled through Centralised Allotment Process as per the rules and regulations of the M. G. University and the college is only looking after Sports, Cultural, community and Management quota in a transparent way. To ensure transparency, the list of admitted students and interview schedule are posted in the college website regularly. Admission is through M.G University Single Window System-CAP
 Selection of candidates to Management Quota is decided by a committee and is based on merit. Due consideration is given to poor and marginalised.3% reduction is given to physically handicapped candidates

6.4 Welfare schemes for
